This campaign, featuring a "Birchway bed", shows the tangible impact that allies like you make when you support Birchway Niagara.


15 of our beds—one third of the 45 beds Birchway Niagara operates— exist only because of community support.

From November 26, 2023 to November 25, 2024, the Ontario Association of Interval and Transition Houses reported **62**

femicides (gender-related killings of women and children) in Ontario. This number is consistent with the previous year and demonstrates why your ongoing support is so critical.

We will be a shoulder to lean on, a voice to advocate for, a space to feel safe in, an ally to trust, a guide to navigate, and a counsellor to heal for everyone affected by abuse of all forms.

lives were lost in Niagara during the same time period.

While not every person experiencing abuse will reach out for support, every additional safe bed means that fewer survivors will be turned away, changing—and possibly saving—lives.

In two of the three deaths in Niagara, the perpetrator was an adult family member who was not an intimate partner.

Coaching Boys into Men Building community mentorship to prevent future violence

Birchway Niagara is proud to have been selected to present the Coaching Boys into Men program in South Niagara. This evidence-based series of brief, coach-led conversations helps student athletes cultivate healthy, respectful relationships.

By weaving lessons on teamwork, integrity and fair play into everyday practices, coaches are giving young people lifelong skills that will improve their lives, create safer communities and increase the impact of **Birchway Niagara's prevention program, which reached 1,729 participants last year**.


