

# FOR DECADES, BIRCHWAY NIAGARA HAS BEEN A COMPASSIONATE PART OF NIAGARA'S COMMUNITY, PROTECTING AND EMPOWERING SURVIVORS OF ABUSE.

Birchway Niagara began in the early 1980s when community members opened two shelters in Welland and Niagara Falls to support women and children experiencing abuse. In 1997, the shelters united under one organization known as Women's Place of South Niagara Inc., and expanded over time to include satellite offices in Port Colborne and Fort Erie.

In 2022, the Niagara Falls shelter was expanded and all of the agency's shelter services were consolidated in this location, allowing an increase in safe beds from 30 to 40. In 2023, Women's Place became Birchway Niagara—a name that reflects our inclusive commitment to ending abuse in all its forms and building a community where everyone can live free from violence.

Guided by the same spirit of community that started our work, we continue to grow as we work with our allies to create a community without abuse.
