Raising the Flag to End Gender-Based Violence across Ontario

Niagara Falls, ON, November 22, 2021 – November is Woman Abuse Prevention Month. Throughout the month, communities across Ontario have been taking part in activities to raise awareness of gender-based violence and the steps needed to end it, such as participating in OAITH's "Wrapped in Courage" campaign, which encourages Ontarians to wear a people scarf as a symbol of the courage it takes to seek support and safety from violence.

As part of this month-long awareness campaign, Women's Place has encouraged municipalities in South Niagara to proclaim November 25th as the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women.
